

TORONTO THINGS TO DO

CN TOWER

ONCE THE TALLEST STRUCTURE ON EARTH FOR OVER 30 YEARS, THE CN TOWER ATTRACTS TRAVELERS TO ITS TWO OBSERVATION DECKS—ONE OF WHICH FEATURES A GLASS FLOOR.

COST: \$43-53 (tickets can be purchased online 1 month in advance)

DISTANCE: Drive - 6 min, Transit - 13 min Walk - 20 min

TIPS: Dine at the 360 Restaurant inside the Tower and get access to observation level for no extra cost



RIPLEY'S AQUARIUM

LOCATED AT THE BASE OF THE CN TOWER, THE AQUARIUM FEATURES NORTH AMERICA'S LONGEST UNDERWATER VIEWING TUNNEL WITH MORE THAN 5.7 MILLION LITRES OF WATER AND OVER 100 INTERACTIVE OPPORTUNITIES.

COST: \$44-48 (tickets can be purchased online 2 months in advance)

DISTANCE: Drive - 6 min, Transit - 13 min Walk - 20 min

TIPS: Get \$5 OFF for visits after 5PM

\$74 for "Sea the Sky" combo ticket if you plan on also visiting CN Tower



TORONTO MUSIC GARDEN

URBAN GARDEN ON THE WATERFRONT DESIGNED IN SUCH A WAY THAT IT ACTUALLY INTERPRETS IN NATURE BACH'S FIRST SUITE FOR UNACCOMPANIED CELLO.

COST: \$0

DISTANCE: Drive - 10 min, Transit - 20 min Walk - 35 min

TIPS: Join in the "Run/Walk for Research" on the morning of May 22 from 1 King West Hotel to Music Gardens and back



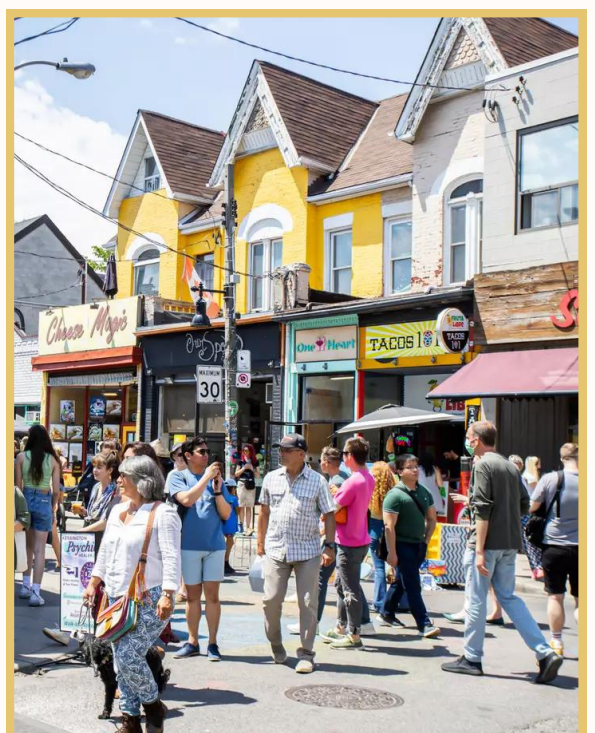
KENSINGTON MARKET

COST: \$0

DISTANCE: Drive - 13 min, Transit - 27 min Walk - 38 min

TORONTO ISLANDS

LOCATED JUST SOUTH OF THE MAINLAND, THE CHAIN OF 15 INTERCONNECTED ISLANDS IS JUST A 13-MINUTE FERRY RIDE FROM DOWNTOWN AND HAS SOME OF THE BEST VISTAS OF THE TORONTO SKYLINE.

COST: \$9.11 by ferry, starting at \$12 by water taxi
DISTANCE: Ferry - 13 min Water Taxi - 10 min

TIPS: Ferry can get busy on the weekends, if you take the water taxi to the island you can ride back on the ferry for free.

HOCKEY HALL OF FAME

HOME OF THE STANLEY CUP! HONOUR THE ACHIEVEMENTS OF SOME OF THE GREATEST STARS IN HOCKEY AT THIS SHRINE TO CANADA'S NATIONAL SPORT.

COST: \$25 (tickets can be purchased online and are valid 12 months from purchase date)
DISTANCE: Drive - 1 min, Transit - n/a Walk - 3 min

TIPS: only open from 10AM-5PM so it is best to go early or on a weekday to beat the crowds



DISTILLERY DISTRICT

A SMALL NEIGHBOURHOOD OF BRICK-LINED STREETS AND DOZENS OF VIBRANTLY RESTORED VICTORIAN INDUSTRIAL BUILDINGS COMPLETELY CLOSED TO TRAFFIC. HOME TO GALLERIES, FASHION, DESIGN AND JEWELRY BOUTIQUES, UNIQUE CAFES AND AWARD-WINNING RESTAURANTS.

COST: \$0
DISTANCE: Drive - 7 min, Transit - 16 min Walk - 25 min

TIPS: Make reservations for restaurants 1 week in advance, especially weekend brunch or dinner between Thurs-Sat

ART GALLERY OF ONTARIO

WITH A COLLECTION OF MORE THAN 90,000 WORKS OF ART, THE AGO IS AMONG THE LARGEST AND MOST DISTINGUISHED ART MUSEUMS IN NORTH AMERICA. AN INTERNATIONAL LANDMARK, HIGHLIGHTS OF THE GALLERY'S WORLD-CLASS COLLECTION INCLUDE ICONIC CANADIAN AND INUIT WORKS, ALONG WITH EUROPEAN AND CONTEMPORARY ART.

COST: \$30
(tickets can be purchased online 3 months in advance)
DISTANCE: Drive - 10 min, Transit - 12 min Walk - 25 min

TIPS: 25 and under are free (must show valid ID)
Free admission to collection galleries every Wednesday from 6-9 pm. Tickets must be pre-booked online
